# Wine without the whining


# **SEE YA LATER RANCH**



# For parents

Midnight Service, Oct. 7 and 8, is the one late-night festival soirée well worth ditching the kids for. It pairs Southernstyle barbecue and live gospel and blues with Swear to God Chardonnay, OMG sparkling wine and other bottles. Ready to come, all ye faithful? (\$110 per ticket; blastedchurch.com)

# ROAD 13 VINEYARD


## For parents

Catch a "Taste with a Thief" (\$45) in Road 13's new barrel room. Sounds like a new edition of Clue, right? At this event, smooth criminals get to use a wine thief (a siphoning instrument) to taste wines from the barrel. (road13vineyards.com)



Straight out of a fairy tale, this medieval stone castle winery is graced with turrets, huge doors and a faux drawbridge—a grand setting for a toy sword duel or a pinkies-up tea party.





# On the Wine Trail with the Kids

For everyone's sanity, take some breaks along the wine route, and build in pre- and post-tour incentives. These are surefire rewards and bribes to help prevent everything from benign pouting to vehicle-stopping hissy fits.

Get an enormous ice cream cone at **Tick-leberry's**. (Hwy. 97, Main Street, Okanagan Falls; 800-667-8002; tickleberrys.com)

Fill a cooler for a picnic at **Okanagan Falls Provincial Park**. *(Green Lake Road at Hwy. 97)* 

Look inside a pit house or hold a snake at **Nk'Mip Desert Cultural Centre**. (1000 Rancher Creek Rd., Osoyoos; 888-495-8555; nkmipdesert.com)

Stay at the **Coast Osoyoos Beach Hotel** with an indoor pool and waterslide. (7702 Main St., Hwy. 3 East; 800-716-6199; coasthotels.com)

Take a trail ride through the sagebrush with **Satary Stables** in Osoyoos. (11305 28 Ave.; 250-495-7400; satarystables.ca)
